KERBSIDE RECYCLING AND REFUSE COLLECTIONS

WEEKLY REFUSE COLLECTION

Raglan has a prepaid bag system.

The bags can be purchased from:

- BP Petrol Station
- Raglan 4 Square Store
- Raglan West Beach Store
- Wainui Road Food Store
- Te Uku Store,
- Xtreme Waste (Te Hutewai Road)
- Waikato District Council's Raglan Office.

WEEKLY RECYCLE COLLECTION

This operates in conjunction with the refuse collection.

Bin to be out by 8.30am.

There is NO kerbside rural recycle collection east of Greenslade road

Collection

Monday – Raglan West

From the west side of Wainui Road bridge to Te Tuhi Road (beyond Whale Bay). Also rural properties out to Waitetuna (Old Mountain Road as far as Bush View Drive). Prepaid bags can be left at the Te Uku Rural Recycling container on Sunday night or Monday morning.

Tuesday – Raglan East

From the east side of the Wainui Road bridge out to Greenslade Road.

Bags to be out by 8.30am.

Statutory Holidays

There is NO collection on a statutory holiday and the collection is done the next day.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

ONLY THE OFFICIAL GREEN BIN WILL BE EMPTIED (additional bins can be purchased from Council's Raglan Office)

GLASS

Bottles and jars – discard lids in refuse

- × No window glass
- × No lightbulbs
- × No ceramics/pottery
- × No crystal
- × No drinking glasses/cups
- × No broken glass

PLASTIC

Household plastic containers, types 

Clear film-bread bags and bubble wrap

(contained inside one bag)

- × No tetrapacks
- × No meat trays
- × No polystyrene
- × No supermarket bags

METAL

Aluminium cans, clean foil plates, clean steel cans, empty aerosols.

Please wash and squash all containers (where applicable) and discard all lids in refuse.



ON TOP OF OR BESIDE THE CRATE

CARDBOARD

Cardboard boxes, cardboard tubes, thin card, cereal and soap boxes

Flatten and tie in a bundle the size of recycle crate

PAPER

Office paper, newspaper, circulars, magazines, glossies/brochures, flattened egg cartons

Flatten and contain securely on top or next to your official recycling crate

Please keep paper and cardboard separate from each other

WE WILL NOT COLLECT

- × Contaminated or dirty containers
- × Items not in the official recycling crate (with the exception of paper and cardboard)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT RECYCLING

Why do I need to wash containers?

Washing helps recycling by reducing contamination, and food leftovers can attract flies or animals. A cold-water rinse is usually enough.

Why should I squash containers?

Flattened cans and bottles are less likely to blow around in the wind and cause litter. Unsquashed items also take up a lot of space in both the crate and collection truck.

Why remove lids?

Lids are usually made of a different plastic or metal and so they may not be able to be recycled with the container. Taking lids off also helps with the processing, making it safer and easier.

What if my recycling does not get collected?

Non-complying materials will be left inside the crate with a sticker explaining the reason for non-collection.
